INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR ON THE OCCASION OF THE 25TH ANNIVERSARY OF NATI PER LEGGERE - BORN TO READ PROGRAMME

Nati per Leggere (Born to read) is a national programme that promotes reading aloud to children from an early age. Scientific studies show that the brain has the greatest capacity for development and learning in the early years of life. Starting to read daily to children from a very young age is not only an important developmental factor but also vital in protecting against socio-cultural disadvantage and an opportunity to build a positive and curious outlook on the world. Nati per Leggere is based on a strong alliance between pediatricians, librarians, educators, midwives, NpL volunteers, and families. The program began in Umbria in 1999, in Assisi, during the national congress of the Cultural Association of Pediatricians. The first library in Umbria to develop an "NpL Network" was the Orvieto Public Library. Celebrating 25 years of NpL in Orvieto, this seminar aims to provide an opportunity to learn about new scientific research results and the importance of emergent literacy, as well as to get to know other international programmes and best practices.
